

## The “Need to Know” Information for Dad and Lad

### WHAT TO BRING FOR Dad and Lad:

### WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Electronic Devices (radio's, TV's, games)	Alcohol, Drugs, Firearms
Glass containers	Moms
Non-Registered Siblings*	Pets

### CAMP POLICIES

- Cub & Adult Partner must remain together at all times
- NO ONE, adult or youth may ride in the back of a pickup truck, even with a shell.
- Keep your campsite clean
- Vehicles are to be parked at the pipeline.
- You will be allowed to unload your gear until 2PM but you MUST park at the pipeline
- No cutting or trimming live trees
- No Liquid fuel is permitted, however, propane lanterns may be used
- Drugs, alcohol and firearms are not permitted on Camp
- No use of tobacco products in front of youth AT ANY TIME, nor in buildings, tents or program areas.
- No sheath knives, axes, or hatchets for Cub Scouts
- No flame inside tents
- ONLY ONE CAMPFIRE PER CAMPSITE (contingent on burn ban regulations). DO NOT LEAVE UNATTENDED.
- Obey posted speed limits. The Cub's life you save may be your son's.
- Damaged equipment must be paid for.

It is understood that:

- REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO 500 CAMPERS EACH WEEKEND.
- This limit was reached quickly last year so turn your applications and fees in EARLY!
- Cub must be accompanied by Dad or other adult male approved by parent.
- PARTICIPATION IS LIMITED TO REGISTERED CUB SCOUTS ONLY; NON-REGISTERED BROTHERS, SISTERS, PETS, ETC. MAY NOT

- ATTEND & WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO STAY.
- No more than 1 non-sibling Cub per dad.
- CHECK IN WILL BE FROM 8:00 a.m. TILL 9:00 a.m. ON SATURDAY.
- **PROGRAM WILL BE CONDUCTED REGARDLESS OF THE WEATHER.**
- Bring sack lunch for Sat. or concessions are available in the Trading Post.

## **NOTICE!!**

**CAMP VEHICLE POLICY:** All vehicles must park in assigned parking areas. No vehicles will be allowed past the gate leading to campsites and Program areas. Your equipment will be transported to your campsite via camp vehicle if it is on the pallet before 11AM or, if you prefer, bring a wagon to take your gear yourself.

**EMERGENCIES:** There is a medic on duty at camp. All medical situations, no matter how small must be reported and recorded in the camp first aid log. If a camper is injured, have an adult bring him to the First Aid Lodge or send for the medic if the camper cannot be moved.

**WEATHER and REFUNDS:** This event will be held regardless of the weather. **NO REFUNDS.**

**PHONES:** There is a pay phone located at the rear of the Trading Post. The **emergency** number at the administration building is 318-982-5623.

**FISHING Tournament-**Will be held on Sunday Morning.

### ***FISHING TOURNAMENT RULES***

1. Begin fishing at 9 a.m. Sunday morning.
2. Fish caught prior to 9 a.m. may not be admitted into the tournament.
3. An adult must stay with each Scout while Scout is fishing.
4. Only fish caught by an individual Scout may be turned in by that scout.
5. Bank fishing only, no swimming, wading, boats, or canoes. **NO FISHING IN THE SWIMMING AREA.**
6. Fish must be turned in to judges at lake pavilion no later than 10:30 a.m. Sunday.
7. All prizes should be awarded by 11 a.m.
8. Awards will be given on several categories. The awards ceremony between 10:30 & 11 a.m.
